Ministerial berth for TN BJP chief

Modi's image makeover; 12 dropped, new comers in

Ministry expansion includes 15 Cabinet & 28 State Ministers

New Delhi, July 8: In a major Union Cabinet makeover, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday dropped 12 ministers including Health Minister Harsh Vardhan, IT and Law Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad and I&B Minister Prakash Javadekar and brought Sarbananda Sonowal, Narayan Rane and Jyotiraditya Scindia and 33 other new members to his government.

Apart from 15 Cabinet ministers, 28 Ministers of State, comprising new faces and those elevated, were sworn in a ceremony which was held in the Darbar Hall of the Rashtrapati Bhavan.

After taking into account 12 resignations hours before the expansion, the total strength of the Council of Ministers to 78, including the Prime Minister. This is the first reshuffle in the Council of Ministers by Prime Minister Modi since he assumed charge for a second term in May 2019.

An extensive and protracted review was carried out by Modi and the BJP top brass through a series of meetings with ministers ahead of Wednesday's big exercise. These meetings were also held in the wake of widespread criticism of the Central government's handling of the COVID crisis.

Most of the members took oath in Hindi, a few of them in English. Outgoing ministers Prasad, Javadekar and Vardhan were also present, while some had their family members watching their oath-taking.

The exit of Prasad comes amid a row between micro-blogging platform Twitter and the government over various issues, including compliance with the new IT rules.

Prasad and Javadekar had also recently announced sweeping regulations for social media firms like Facebook and Twitter, OTT players as well as digital media.

Health Minister Vardhan, whose handling of the COVID-19 crisis had drawn flak from the opposition

parties, resigned from the Union Council of Ministers just hours before the expansion.

The expansion-cum-reshuffle of the Cabinet is seen by many political observers as an image makeover exercise by Modi as he brought in young faces and gave representation to various social groups and regions in the government. While the average age of the Council of Ministers has come down to 58 years, the new entrants also include many with high educational and professional qualifications.

Scindia and Rane, who switched over from the Congress and the Shiv Sena respectively, bagged Cabinet berths while new entrants of West Bengal were seen as

an attempt to bolster the BJP's prospects in the TMC-ruled state that recently saw a high-octane electoral battle.

Lok Sabha MP from Bihar's Hajipur Pashupati Kumar Paras, who is embroiled in a feud with nephew Chirag Paswan over the control of Ram Vilas Paswan-founded Lok Janshakti Party, was also sworn in as a Cabinet minister.

The reshuffle also saw JD(U) joining the government with Rajya Sabha MP from Bihar R.C.P. Singh being made a Cabinet minister.

Kiren Rijju, R.K. Singh, Hardeep Singh Puri, Mansukh Mandaviya, Parshottam Rupala, G. Kishan Reddy and Anurag Thakur were elevated to the Cabinet level.

Bhupendra Yadav, who has been serving in the BJP organisation as a general secretary, was also sworn-in as a Cabinet minister.

Among the 28 Ministers of State, seven are from Uttar Pradesh which goes to polls next year with the BJP seeking a second term there. The list also included BJP's Tamil Nadu state president L. Murugan, who is not an MP as also Sonawal. Both of them would need to get elected to either Lok Sabha or Rajya Sabha within six months. Seven women were among the 43 who took oath, taking the total number of women ministers in the government to 11.

Swearing-in under new normal

While all eyes were on Wednesday riveted at the Rashtrapati Bhavan for the swearing-in of new ministers, the ceremony held under the shadow of the COVID-19 pandemic did not see the usual scenes of public bonhomie as leaders maintained social distancing.

All the dignitaries present, including President Ram Nath Kovind and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, were wearing masks during the nearly 90-minute event at the Darbar Hall where two platforms had been installed.

Representatives from different political parties especially leaders of opposition in both houses of parliament were missing as the number of invitees was restricted due to the COVID-19 protocol.

Only one family member of each minister was allowed. Vice-President Venkaiah Naidu and Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, besides a few top officials including P.K. Mishra, principal secretary to the Prime Minister, were also in attendance.

Huge explosion on ship in Dubai

Dubai, July 8:

A fiery explosion erupted on a container ship anchored in Dubai at one of the world's largest ports late Wednesday, authorities said, sending tremors across the commercial hub of the United Arab Emirates. The blaze sent up giant orange flames on a vessel at the crucial Jebel Ali Port, the busiest in the Middle East that sits on the eastern side of the Arabian Peninsula.

The combustion unleashed a shock wave through the skyscraper-studded city of Dubai, causing walls and windows to shake in neighbourhoods as far as 25 kilometers (15 miles) away from the port. Panicked residents filmed from their high-rises as a fiery ball illuminated the night sky.

There were no immediate reports of casualties at the port, which is also the busiest port of call for

American warships outside the US.

Some 2 1/2 hours after the blast, Dubai's civil defense teams said they had brought the fire under control and started the cooling process. Authorities posted footage on social media of firefighters dousing giant shipping containers. The glow of the blaze remained visible in the background as civil defense crews worked to contain the fire.

The extent of damage caused to the sprawling port and surrounding cargo was not immediately clear. Footage shared on social media of the aftermath showed charred containers, ashes and littered debris.

The sheer force and visibility of the explosion suggested the presence of a highly combustible substance. A Dubai

police commander told the Saudi-owned Al-Arabiya TV that the fire appeared to have started in one of the containers holding flammable material, without elaborating. Mona al-Marri, director general of Dubai Media Office, told Al-Arabiya that this incident could happen anywhere in the world and that authorities were investigating the cause. The Jebel Ali Port at the northern end of Dubai is the largest man-made deep-water harbour in the world and serves cargo from the Indian subcontinent, Africa and Asia. The port is not only a critical global cargo hub, but a lifeline for Dubai and surrounding emirates, serving as the point of entry for essential imports. Dubai authorities did not identify the stricken ship beyond saying it was a small vessel with a capacity of 130 containers.

INDIAN LEGENDS IN OLYMPICS Part - 4

Keeping India's flag flying high in global meets

Milkha Singh was aptly termed as the 'Flying Sikh' for his exploits on the athletics track. Though born before India's Independence, he became the nation's first athlete to dominate the track and field with a high sense of verve. The lack of guidance and training - the bane of many Indian sportspersons - turned out to be a great heartbreak as Milkha missed a bronze medal by the proverbial whisker in the 400 metres event of the 1960 Rome Olympic Games.

Milkha Singh (November 20, 1929-June 18, 2021) was Independent India's first individual sports star, who dominated Indian track and field for over a decade with his speed and spirit, creating multiple records and winning numerous medals in his career.

Representing India at the 1956 Olympics in Melbourne, the 1960 Olympics in Rome and the 1964 Olympics in Tokyo, Milkha Singh remained the greatest Olympian from India for decades with his phenomenal displays.

Born on 20 November 1929 into a Sikh family in Govindpura, which is now a part of Pakistan, Milkha Singh was introduced to the sport only after he had fled to India post the partition and joined the Indian Army.

It was in the army where he sharpened his running skills. After he finished sixth in a cross-country race that had around 400 more soldiers running, he was handpicked

for further training. That laid the foundation for what would be an impressive career.

His first Olympic Games came at Melbourne 1956, where an inexperienced Milkha Singh didn't progress beyond the heat stages in either the 200m or 400m, but a meeting with champion Charles Jenkins proved to be the source of much inspiration.

A resolute Milkha Singh left Melbourne determined to, in his words, turn himself into "a running machine".

That desire resulted in Singh becoming the first gold medallist at the Commonwealth Games from independent India in 1958, remaining the only Indian male to have an individual athletics Commonwealth Games gold for 56 years before discus thrower Vikas Gowda in the 2014 edition.

By the time of the Rome 1960 Olympics, Singh was widely known as "the Flying Sikh" and came within a photo finish of reaching the heights of an Olympic podium.

Running in the 400m, Milkha Singh was leading till the 200m mark when he had decided to ease off, a mistake that allowed others to overtake him. The race had seen numerous records being broken and eventually needed a photo finish to adjudge the result.

While United States of America's Otis Davis had won the race after leading Germany's Carl Kaufmann by one-hundredth of a second, Milkha Singh had finished fourth with a timing of 45.73s - a national record that stood for 40 years.

Tokyo 1964 was the swansong for Milkha Singh, as he led the Indian team in the 4x400m relay before hanging up his running shoes.

Years later, Singh - with help from his daughter Sonia Sanwalka - would share memories from his incredible career in his autobiography titled "The Race of My Life", published in July 2013.

The book was later turned into a biopic, namely *Bhaag Milkha Bhaag*, which was directed by Rakeysh Omprakash Mehra and had actor Farhan Akhtar playing Milkha Singh.

All TNPL matches in Chennai; tourney from July 19

Chennai, July 8:

The fifth season of the Tamil Nadu Premier League T20 tournament will begin on July 19 as the state government has given the event its clearance.

All the matches in the eight-team league, including the final, will be played at the M A Chidambaram Stadium here, Tamil Nadu Cricket Association (TNCA) secretary R.S. Ramasaamy said.

"The Tamil Nadu government formally approved holding the TNPL 2021 tournament on July 1 subject to no spectators and strict COVID protocols. After discussions with all the stakeholders, it was decided to start the 2021 edition of TNPL from July 19 to August 15," Ramasaamy was quoted as saying in a release on Wednesday.

The teams are currently in quarantine at a city hotel and will begin practice on July 9, the TNCA secretary said.

"The teams are starting their practice on July 9 at Chepauk after extensive testing, quarantine and following strict bubble rules. The BCCI Anti-corruption team will be in place for the tournament for education and monitoring," Ramasaamy added. Some of Tamil Nadu's leading players - R. Ashwin, Washington Sundar, R. Sai Kishore, Varun Chakravarthy and Sandeep Warrier - would not be available for the tournament as they are busy with national commitments. Experienced stumper batsman Dinesh Karthik is away in the UK on commentary duties and is also likely to miss the event.

India all-rounder Vijay Shankar is among the notable names who will be seen in action.

The 2020 edition of the TNPL was not held owing to the COVID-19 pandemic and the lockdown. The T20 league features eight teams - defending champions Chepauk Super Gillies, Dindigul Dragons, LYCA Kovai Kings, Salem Spartans, iDream Tiruppur Tamizhans, Ruby Trichy Warriors, Nellai Royal

Kings and Siechem

Madurai Panthers. All 32 matches, including the final, will be played at MA

Chidambaram Stadium.

There will be seven double headers in the league phase, which will be held without a break.

Mixed luck for Anand in Croatia Grand Chess tour event

Zagreb, July 8:

Former world champion Viswanathan Anand started with a fluent win over Dutch Grandmaster Jorden van Foreest before faltering against Maxime Vachier-Lagrave in the second round of rapid event in the Croatia Grand Chess Tour tournament which began here on Wednesday.

He drew his third round match against Ian Nepomniachtchi of Russia.

The 51-year old Indian maestro, who is playing his first over-the-board event in over one year, defeated Forest in 54 moves in a Sicilian Defence game.

However, he could not repeat the magic against his French opponent in the second round, going

down in 48 moves in a Caro-Kann Defence encounter.

Anand drew his third round match against Russian GM

The matches will be broadcast by Star India on its various channels including Star Sports Tamil.

Nepomniachtchi, who will challenge Magnus Carlsen for the World champion title later this year.

Hurkacz ends Federer's dream run

London, July 8:

Eight-time Wimbledon champion Roger Federer lost 6-3, 7-6 (4), 6-0 to 14th-seeded Hubert Hurkacz of Poland in the quarterfinals at the All England Club on Wednesday.

Federer turns 40 next month and never was able to summon the serving and shot-making that have carried him to 20 Grand Slam titles overall.

That is tied with Rafael Nadal for the most by a man in tennis

history.

Hurkacz is a 24-year-old from Poland who had not made it past the third round at any major tournament until this one.

Novak Djokovic and Denis Shapovalov also reached the semifinals with wins Wednesday.

If Djokovic beats Shapovalov and then goes on to claim a sixth Wimbledon title and third in a row on Sunday, that would allow the 34-year-old from Serbia to tie Federer and Nadal with 20 Slam trophies.
