Avesh misses chance to prove mettle

Pacer out of sorts, gets tonked by minnows

Dubai, Sept 1: The Indian team has been giving fast bowler Avesh Khan an extended run, giving him more matches to play despite giving away runs aplenty. The right-arm medium-pacer from Madhya Pradesh made his T20I debut early this year against the West Indies. While he has taken 13 wickets in 15 matches, he has gone at an economy rate of 9.10.

His economy rate rose from 8.72 before the start of the Asia Cup Group A match against Hong Kong here on Wednesday to 9.10, courtesy his 53 runs in four overs.

One wonders why Khan has been given such a long rope. He is known to have more pace and hence preferred, but his accuracy has a lot left to be desired. He has won man of the match award in the West Indies for his figures of two for 17 in four overs in Florida early last month.

Against Hong Kong,

Khan had the best opportunity to portray himself as an efficient fast bowler and bowl tidily so that the team management does not hit him. However, he has done himself no good after going for 13.25 runs an over against the minnows. He conceded 12 runs in his first over with Hong Kong batsman Babar Hayat smashing him straight for a six and a four to long-off. He gave away 13 runs in his second over when Aizaz Khan smashed him over deep extra cover for another six.

Bowling a poor length outside the off stump and half-volleys invited the inexperienced Hong Kong batsmen to put their front foot forward and deposit him over the ropes. Otherwise, it was the short balls that begged to be hit over the mid-wicket region for maximum.

The 25-year-old Khan was smashed for 21 runs in his fourth over, the penultimate over of

the Hong Kong innings that included a six over covers, one over third man and two successive fours behind the wicket on either side of the wicket. Khan's best over in the match was his third over in which he gave away eight runs and took a wicket.

The Indian think-tank may believe that Khan can take wickets with his pace and thinks nothing is wrong with him. Suryakumar Yadav, who turned the match in India's favour with some unbelievable hitting in the last seven overs of the Indian innings, said: "Nothing is going bad. He was man of the match recently in the West Indies. Bowlers may have off days sometimes. It is all about execution. It is better to experiment things in the matches rather than in the nets. Everyone is in a good space."

Time is running out for Khan. He may lose his spot once Jasprit Bumrah is back into the team.

Harshal Patel will also be a preferred bowler and Deepak is Chahar waiting in the reserves.

The same holds good for young left-arm pacer Arshdeep Singh, who went for 44 runs in his four overs against Hong Kong. Both of them went for a combined 97 runs in eight overs, reducing the victory margin to 40 while it should have been much more.

"We tried our best to reduce Hong Kong for less. We wanted to keep the victory margin big. But, they put up a good fight. They must have done something right to qualify for the Asia Cup. The pitch became a little easier to bat in the second innings," said Yadav, who was man of the match for his 26-ball 68 not out that took India to 192 for two. Hong Kong made 152 in 20 overs, courtesy tidy overs by Bhuvneshwar Kumar as well as spinners Ravindra Jadeja and Yuzvendra Chahal to leave India victors by 40 runs.

Hardik jumps to 5th spot in all-rounder rankings

Dubai, Sept 1: Stars at the Asia Cup have made progress in the latest ICC T20 Rankings, with India's Hardik Pandya headlining the multiple moves.

Pandya's exceptional individual performance against Pakistan helped him jump eight places on the T20I all-rounder rankings, up to fifth

position, his highest ever spot.

The hard-hitting fast-bowler claimed 3/25 and made 33 not out from just 17 balls, showing how vital his impact will be in India's T20 World Cup campaign later in the year in Australia.

Elsewhere, Afghanistan's blistering start to the tournament

has not gone unnoticed, with a number of players rewarded in the updated rankings.

Rashid Khan's push for the No.1 bowler position has been helped with a two-spot jump to third (708 points), over fellow leg-spinners Adil Rashid and Adam Zampa (Australia).

South Africa left-arm

wrist-spinner Tabraiz Shamsi (716) is next in Rashid's sights, though Australian Josh Hazlewood (792) boasted strong margin at the top of the list.

Rashid's compatriot Mueeb Ur Rahman meanwhile has entered the top ten with a seven-spot move up the rankings (660), currently edged out for eighth by Bhuvneshwar Kumar (661), whose 4/26 against Pakistan helped the men in blue for victory.

There were no new entrants in the T20I batting top ten, though there was a push from Pakistan's Mohammad Rizwan, moving up to second (796) to join Babar Azam (810) in the top two.

Honda Racing ropes in Spanish rider

New Delhi, Sept 1: Honda Racing Corporation (HRC) announced the signing of the 2020 MotoGP World Champion Spanish rider Joan Mir.

The 24-year-old will compete aboard the Honda RC213V in the Factory Team on a two-year contract alongside Marc Marquez.

Mir established himself as a World Champion-level talent from his first full season in Moto3 in 2016. In 2017, he lifted the lightweight class crown aboard a Honda before moving to the intermediate class the following year.

Alongside two World Championships, the Spanish rider has claimed 12 Grand Prix wins and 33 podiums.

Durand Cup Football: Chennaiyin in must win situation

Imphal, Sept 1: Chennaiyin FC will need a win when they take on I-League outfit TRAU FC in their third match of the Durand Cup here on Thursday.

The Group C match is scheduled to be held at Imphal's Khuman Lampak Stadium at 6 p.m. It will be the first evening kick-off for Chennaiyin FC this

season. With Hyderabad FC having qualified for the knockout stage from Group C, Chennaiyin will be fighting for second spot with three other teams in their group to progress.

Presently, Chennaiyin find themselves placed at the bottom of Group C with one point from two matches. But all this could change quickly. A win by three goals over TRAU FC will catapult the Marina Machans to a joint second spot with NEROCA FC.

Talking about the match, Chennaiyin coach Brdaric said, "TRAU are an experienced team. They have good players. We watched them two times. They have weaknesses too and we should exploit them at the right moment. We have to win. It's like a final. We want to show the fans that we have learned the

lessons from our previous matches and are prepared for the fight." Thomas Brdaric side have played only two matches while all other teams in the group have played three matches each.

TRAU FC, though, will be coming into the fixture on the back of a 2-1 win over Army Red.

Speaking about his side's preparations, Brdaric stated, "We must be positive every time. Everybody is important for our development. We are still in the preparation stage. Of course, we need positive results for reconfidence. Sometimes, it's tough to understand that even if we play well, we can lose a match. So our mindset is very important." Chennaiyin will miss the services of Senegalese defender Fallou Diagne who was shown a red card in the previous match.

Srikanth enters last 16 of Japan Open Super 750

Osaka, Sept 1: Former World No. 1 Kidambi Srikanth advanced to the men's singles round of 16 while Lakshya Sen and Saina Nehwal suffered early exits at the Japan Open Super 750 badminton tournament here on Wednesday.

Srikanth outplayed an All England champion Malaysia's Lee Zii Jia 22-20, 23-21 in a gruelling encounter. He will be up against Japan's Kanta Tsuneyama in the next round.

"It was a close match and could have gone either way but I am happy with the way I played. It's important to close out games at this high level because every match is going to be tough," Olympics.com quoted Srikanth as saying.

"I was leading 16-12 in the first game but found myself behind 20-18 after giving away too many points. I just told myself to be consistent and not give easy points. I am always happy to win and now I will go back and think about how to beat my next opponent," he added.

The All England runner-up Lakshya

Sen, however, bowed out early after losing to local shuttler Kenta Nishimoto 21-18, 14-21, 13-21 in the preliminary round.

London Olympic medallist Saina Nehwal too knocked out after falling to reigning two-time world champion Japan's Akane Yamaguchi

9-21, 17-21.

The pair of M R Arjun and Dhruv Kapila, who became the first Indian men's doubles pair to make the world championship quarterfinals last week, suffered 21-19, 21-23, 15-21 loss at the hands of Korean combination
